Below are announcements broken out specifically for middle/high school followed by news for all grades!

Announcements for Middle School Families:

Shakespeare: LAST CHANCE TO JOIN SHAKESPEARE IS THIS WEEK! There is still room in the after school theatre class for interested students! There are two separate classes, so you can take your pick between Tuesday or Thursday. Dress Code: Please be sure to check your middle school student for dress code on the way out of the house in the mornings! As a reminder, students should be wearing all GALS on top (including sweatshirts, hoodies, and jackets), athletic bottoms (no writing larger than a name tag), and sneakers. As the weather gets colder, students may wear boots, jackets, hats, scarves, etc. to school but must have dress code gear to change into once they get to school.

Cell Phone Policy: As a reminder, we are continuing our cell phone policy of having phones turned in every morning. We did that all last quarter and many students did such a beautiful job of following the process. Per GALS policy, we have always said that phones need to be off and put away. With our new policy, we believe that phones are actually SAFER given that they are locked away in the Dean's office all day. In order to celebrate the students who have been consistently meeting expectations, we will start doing biweekly dress down days for the wellness squads who have the greatest percentage of phones turned in. We recognize that not all students have phones and would never punish a student for not having a phone to turn in, so we will be looking at percentages to determine which wellness squad has the greatest numbers of phones being turned in.

School Closure Due to Emergencies or Bad Weather: This is a reminder that GALS will always align with DPS for emergency or snow day closures. If DPS closes due to bad weather, GALS/The Boys School will also be closed. Under certain circumstances, GALS/The Boys School may decide to close when DPS doesn't, but we will always notify families prior to 6:30am

if that happens. It is best practice to monitor the local news stations for school closures when the weather is bad.

Intent-to-Return Forms: We will soon be asking all families to complete an 'intent to return' form to understand if you intend to return to GALS for the 2019-2020 school year. Knowing ahead of time helps us with budgeting, scheduling, and planning. Thanks in advance for your help!

Student Safety around morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up: The safety of our students is very important to us at GALS! Dropoff and Pickup will continue to be on Fox and Galapago using the same entrances we've used in the past.

Students will not be allowed to enter the building before 7:40am, and may not stay after dismissal unless they are enrolled in an afterschool activity. We will use our discretion when it's below freezing to allow students into the building before 7:40am. However, no students will be allowed to enter the building (regardless of the weather) until the office opens at 7:30am. Students may not be unsupervised in our building at anytime before or after school. Please see Dismissal and School Hours Policies below.

2018-2019 Dismissal Policy - Reminder: For the 2018-2019 school year, the Girls Athletic Leadership Schools will dismiss all students at 3:50 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. After-school activities dismiss at 5:00pm. On Wednesday, school is dismissed at 1:45 p.m. After-school activities dismiss at 4:00 p.m. If your student is not picked up within 15 minutes of dismissal, the Girls Athletic Leadership Schools cannot assure ongoing supervision of students, undertakes no responsibility for after-hours supervision of students, and will have no costs or liability arising from events that may occur as a result of lack of supervision. However, students will be held accountable for their behavior.

Students who have not been picked up after regular dismissal by 4:00pm; or after after-school activities by 5:15pm (MTThF) or by 4:15pm (W); may go to the Boys and Girls Club located at 808 Inca St. for homework help and quiet reading time. Students may also walk individually to the Byers Branch Public Library at 7th and Santa Fe. Staff members are not responsible for drop off at the library or Boys and Girls Club.

Supervision is only assured until 4:00pm Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, and 1:55 p.m. on Wednesday. If an employee of Girls Athletic Leadership Schools elects to remain with a student past the 15 minute window for pickup that does not reflect a practice of the School and does not guarantee that supervision will be provided on any future occasion. Your child's safety is in your responsibility, beginning 15 minutes after the end of their daily schedule at GALS.

School Hours - Reminder: GALS' academic school day begins promptly at 8:00am with a rolling drop-off beginning at 7:40am. Students will not be supervised, nor will the building be open to students until 7:40. Students will need to remain outside of the building until GALS' staff open the doors. On Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, school ends at 3:50pm. Wednesdays are early release days, and students are finished with school at 1:45pm. Please note that students will be engaged in learning activities until the end of their school day, and it is of the utmost importance that they are in school, on time, all day, every day.

Street Smarts: We would also like to remind you to please emphasize to your student(s) the importance of the use of crosswalks when walking to school in the mornings or leaving the building after school. Please drop off and pick up on the north bound sidewalk of Galapago Street, or the south bound sidewalk of Fox Street. Avoid dropping off or picking up in the opposite lanes and having student(s) cross in the middle of these busy streets. We will do our best to encourage students to use the crosswalks, but your support with getting this message across is crucial.

Lost & Found: The GALS lost & found is in the bathroom of the nurse's station right off the front office. Some teachers keep a lost and found bin in their classrooms with the hope that students are more likely to look in some place they visit daily. Lost jewelry, glasses or other items of value are held by front office staff in a more secure location. The lost & found already has stuff in it - including binders, pencil cases and clothes. As we approach cooler weather, the lost & found becomes overwhelmingly full quickly. The school policy at these times is to remind girls to check it because unclaimed items are taken away at the end of each week. Dress code worthy items are put into the dress code bins. Other items are donated to charity. The kind parent who

tries to help us stay on top of lost & found does try to hold onto more valuable coats for longer, but eventually her house gets full too.

Please put your students' name in items of value. We do try to look for names. Please be aware that even sharpie can bleed and fade and sometimes names are not legible. We do feel it is the student's responsibility to try to find their gear. Parents are always welcome to come dig through the lost & found bin or ask about a specific item. We cannot take responsibility for finding the owner of unclaimed items. Thanks for your support!
